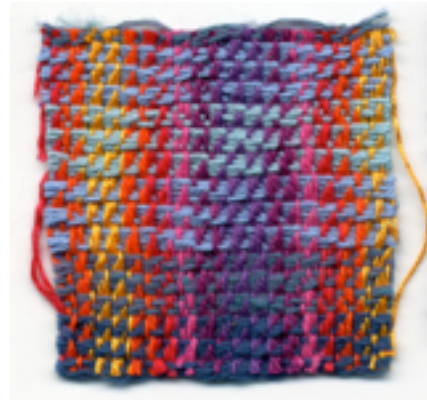
## Membership Corner

## 2017 President's Challenge - "Pick 2" It's Not Too Late to Pick

Close your eyes and pick one structure and one color scheme from the color wheel (triad, complementary, etc). Use these to plan your weaving project.

There will also be two containers for knitting, "stitch pattern" and "color." Use these to make a knitting project.

At the March guild meeting the finished projects will be displayed and voted on for a prize. The projects will be displayed on our MWG table at Florida Tropical Weavers Conference in March.

Do not fear!! We have an entire guild of helpers if you pick a pattern, structure, or color scheme you're unfamiliar with. This is a great way to stretch your artistic limits!

## April Meeting: Fun with Flip Flops



At the April 8 guild meeting Barb Cabral will discuss fun ways to work with flip-flops, using handspun, handwoven, crochet, ribbon, and macramé for straps. She'll share ideas for incorporating beads in the straps and coordinating jewelry and talk about construction ideas, glues and finishing techniques. Also, how to make your own soles or re-make commercial shoes will be discussed.

# Manasota Weavers' Guild Meeting Minutes

## January 14, 2017

Our first 2017 meeting was held at our new location at the Arts and Cultural Alliance of Sarasota, 1226 N. Tamiami Trail, in the meeting room behind the Designing Women shop. This is a perfect new home for our guild and thanks go out again to Maureen Carlson for facilitating our relocation.

Priscilla Fort called the meeting to order at 12:15 p.m. There were 23 members present along with 3 guests. Priscilla welcomed our guests and made introductions. We hope you will join us again.

### Committee Reports

Minutes: The minutes of the December 2016 meeting were accepted as printed in our last newsletter.

Treasurer: Lynn Brusky reported that the guild finances broke even for 2016 and with the addition of membership dues the balance is now higher. She mentioned that our annual January stash sale is a large fund raiser for the guild and is important in terms of helping to cover the cost of our monthly storage rent.

Sunshine: There was a reminder to give Ginny Schuele the names of anyone who would appreciate a note from the guild. Ginny has recently sent a greeting card to Marion Hoercher and will send one as well to Jean Woodward. Margarete Griffiths also mentioned that Randall Darwall, a well-known weaver, had passed away.

Newsletter: The deadline to for the next newsletter is February 3, 2017. Margarete Griffiths reminded us to provide her with "mystery" stash photos to be included in our newsletter.

Library: Ruth Holm has the guild library in her home and will be happy to send books and/or videos to our monthly meetings when requested.

### Other Business

FAB: Kathie Hayes brought in postcards advertising FAB 2017 and asked members to distribute them to publicize the sale. Kathie told us there are a few artist spaces still available if anyone else would like to participate in FAB. If there are any questions, please contact Jozette Stubbe. Donations towards light snacks for the Wednesday evening opening reception would be appreciated.

Twill Study Group: Ginny Schuele circulated a sign-up sheet for the twill study group starting in the next couple of weeks. Each person will choose an individual project to work on at home as a learning experience. The group will meet a couple of times to compare notes and perhaps exchange samples.



The Haven: Volunteers are needed to warp small looms, do some finishing sewing at home, pick up and deliver projects, etc.

President's Challenge: Irene Ouimet spoke to us about the third annual President's challenge. More than 10 members are involved this year. The challenge is to experiment and make samples with different color palettes, structures, techniques, etc. in weaving, knitting or spinning. The finished samples should be brought to our March meeting and will make up our guild display at the Florida Tropical Weavers' Conference in March. Irene is generously donating prizes for the challenge. Last year's prizes included gift cards from First Watch and A Good Yarn.

Workshops: Margarete reported that there are 15 people registered for the Betty Vera Color and Weave workshop being held at the Waldemere fire station February 13-15. There are still 5 more spots available for participation in the workshop.

Priscilla notified us of some upcoming events. A Good Yarn will be running classes with John Mullarkey and Franklin Habit from January 26-29. Also, the Venice Art Center is holding a nuno felting workshop February 13/14. Priscilla mentioned as well that A Good Yarn holds a drop-in weaving clinic at the shop every Monday from 9-11 a.m.

Karen Simpson reported that Barbara Cabral is taking weaving instruction in Cambodia at the moment, with scholarship help from our guild. She has a Facebook page with information about her trip. Barbara will be giving us a presentation on her experience in Cambodia at our April meeting.

Handweavers Guild of America (HGA): The guild will take out an annual membership (\$50) in HGA. An individual membership fee is \$45. Membership, among other things, entitles us to receive HGA's Shuttle, Spindle & Dyepot magazine. The magazines, as they arrive, will be circulated at our meetings before being added to our library. Membership in HGA also offers reduced registration rates for Convergence as well as the opportunity to participate in study leading to a Certificate of Excellence. Jozette Stubbe will be our liaison with the national guild. Three lucky members went home with one of the tote bags donated to us by HGA.

Show and Tell: Martha Oppenheimer showed us a beautiful tablecloth woven in a blue plaid on a 9-yard warp of 16/2 cotton with a sett of 32 epi. Martha asked us for suggestions on finishing the tablecloth. Karen Simpson brought in a handspun skein of blended Polwarth and silk in lovely purples and greens. She also showed us a stunning length of fabric woven with a Blazing Shuttles painted warp of 6/2 tencel with added 8/2 tencel green stripes. Karen felt that the 8/2 tencel may have been better if it were sett differently than the 6/2. We agreed that the ripple effect of the green stripes was quite attractive. Winnie Nelon finished off our show and tell with some interesting workshop samples done at the Textile Society of America in Savannah.

Next meeting: Saturday, February 11. Our speaker at this meeting will be Michael White of the Georgia Yarn Co. who will give us a presentation on cotton from field to yarn.

The business meeting adjourned at 1:10 p.m.

Program: The program this month was our annual guild stash sale of equipment and yarn donated to the guild over the past year. Many people went home with more yarn to add to their stash and others acquired new equipment. Thanks to everyone for supporting the guild in this way.

Our regular monthly member stash sales will resume at our February meeting, with 10% of any sales being donated to the guild.
